***Please stand as you are able**

This evening ashes will be imposed upon all those who wish to receive ash on their foreheads. In the New Covenant our Lord has not commanded the imposition of ashes. Christians voluntarily observe this rite because of the example set in the Old Testament when Job repented in dust and in ashes (Job 42:6) and on one occasion when our Lord is lamenting the impenitent, He does so in part by saying that the penitent would have repented in sackcloth and in ashes (Matthew 11:21). The custom is therefore a useful reminder of the fact that the bodies which we possess will one day return to dust because of our rebellion against God Most High (Genesis 3:19; 18:27).
