Obituary for Donald F. Luth

Donald F. Luth, age 82 of Newman, IL, went home to be with the Lord on Wednesday, April 8, 2015 at Carle Foundation Hospital in Urbana, IL.

Don was born December 3, 1932 in Newman, IL to Oswald Henry and Frieda (Frenz) Luth. He married Esther Mae Craig on August 12, 1953 in Reno, NV. Don was a veteran of the United States Army, having served during the Korean War. After his military service, he returned to Newman and farmed for over 55 years. He was a member of the Immanuel Lutheran Church in Broadlands, IL and participated in the Men's Club. He also was a member of the Newman American Legion Post #201, where he served as past Post Adjutant, and the Elks Lodge in Savoy.
