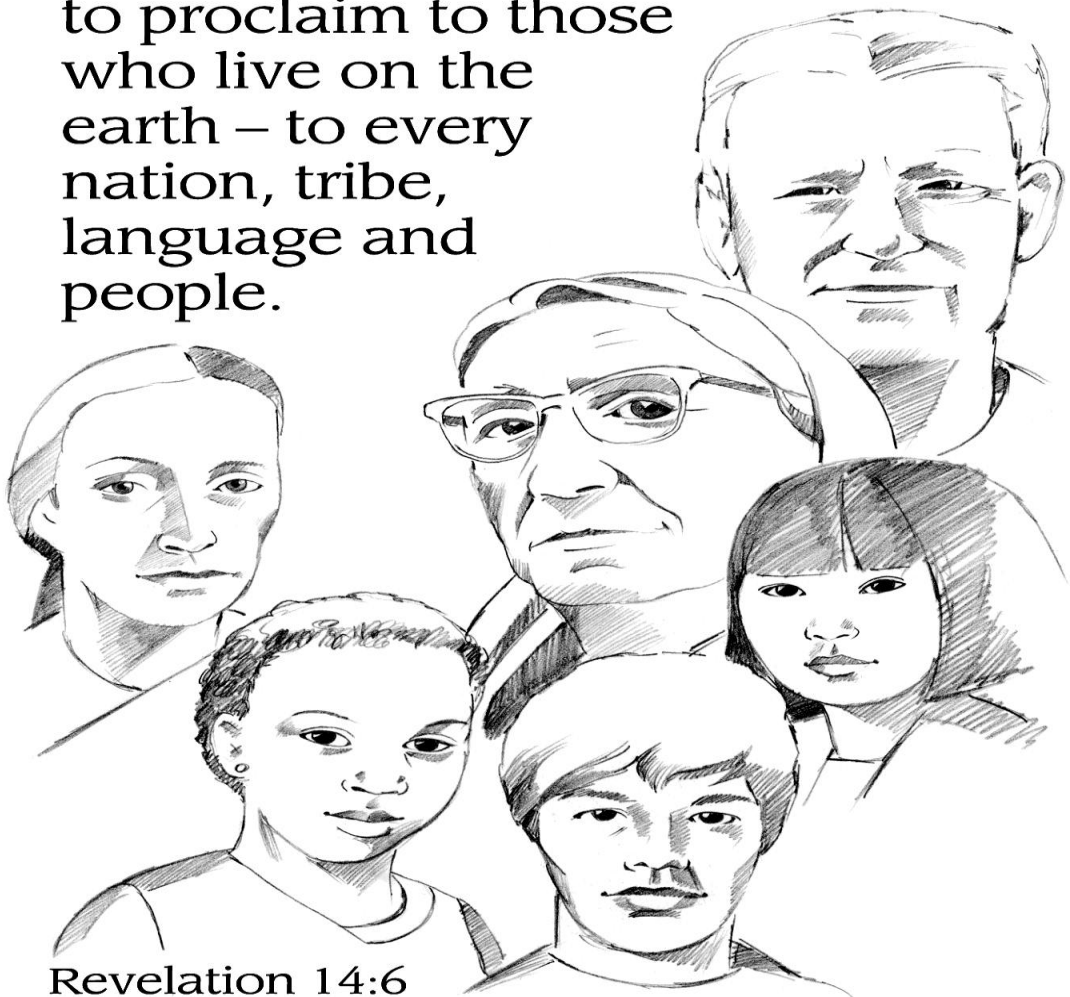

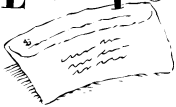
DECORATE A TABLE!
