ever. Amen.**

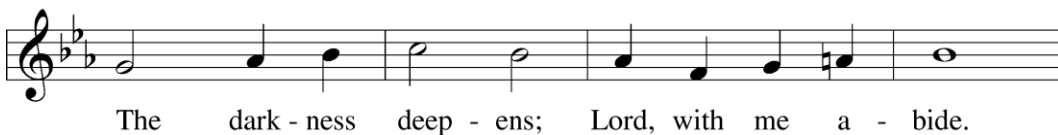
